Togo is ranked 99th out of 128 countries in the Rule of Law Index with a score of 0.45 on a scale from 0 (worst possible score) and 1 (best possible score). This means that this country performs poorly in the areas of corruption, openness of government and enforcement of regulations around rights, order, security, civil and criminal law.

The score awarded for transparency and accountability (including public management and civil service integrity, and access to information) in Togo is 24 on a scale from 0 (very weak) to 100 (very strong). This score is considered weak by [Global Integrity](#).
